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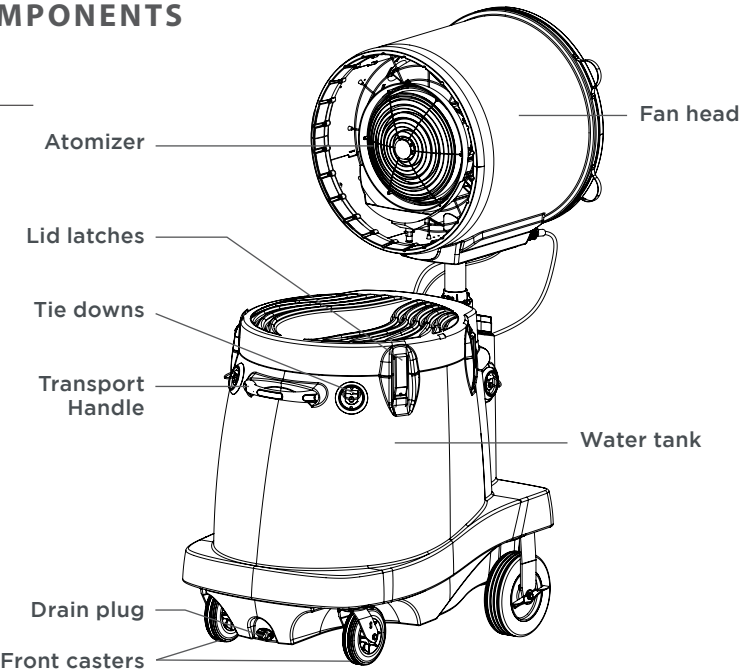
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A. WARNINGS

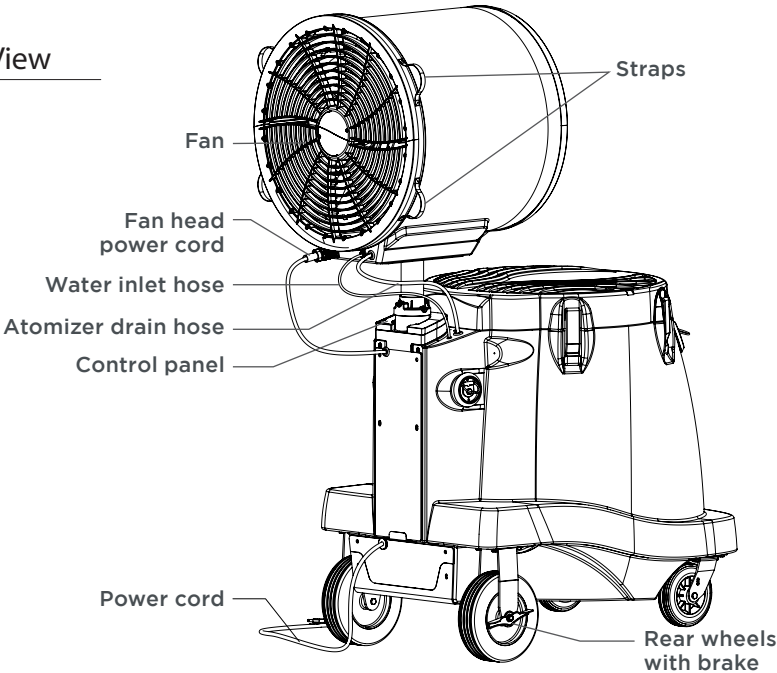
- This Cooling Unit is intended for use only as specified in this manual. If you have questions about its use, please contact Power Breezer.

- Use only on a outlet protected by a ground-fault circuit-interrupter (GFCI). (see page 9)
- Avoid using extension cords.
- Do not allow plug to become wet. Do not plug in while hands are wet. Doing so causes risk of electric shock.
- Do not alter the plug in any way.
- If the power cord is damaged, do not attempt to repair it yourself. Contact Power Breezer customer service for assistance.

- Turn off and unplug the Cooling Unit prior to filling or emptying water reservoir.
- Turn off and unplug the Cooling Unit prior to moving.
- Turn off and unplug the Cooling Unit prior to cleaning it.
- Always unplug the Cooling Unit by pulling on the plug and never on the cord.
- Do not insert fingers or other objects inside the fan head, doing so may cause bodily injury.
- Children can fall into open water reservoir and drown, even in a small amount of water. Keep children away from reservoir. Keep reservoir lid on at all times.
- Closely supervise nearby children and pets when using this Cooling Unit. Do not leave Cooling Unit unattended.
- Children shall not play with the Cooling Unit.
- Cleaning and user maintenance shall not be made by children without supervision.
- The Cooling Unit is not to be used by persons (including children) with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities, or lack of experience and knowledge, unless they have been given supervision or instruction.
- This Cooling Unit can be used by children aged from 8 years and above and persons with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities or lack of experience and knowledge if they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the Cooling Unit in a safe way and understand the hazards involved.
- When operating Cooling Unit, use common sense. Stay clear of moving parts and only use water that is safe for drinking.
- Improper installation and or manual rotation of the Fan Head may cause a tipping hazard. (see page 8)
- If the Cooling Unit becomes damaged or malfunctions, do not attempt to repair the Cooling Unit. Doing so will void the warranty. Contact Power Breezer customer service for repair assistance. **954-418-4530 | customerservice@powerbreezer.com**
- The appliance is not to be used by persons (including children) with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities, or lack of experience and knowledge, unless they have been given supervision or instruction" or equivalent.
- This Cooling Unit is suitable for use as a fan for tropical climates.
- This Cooling Unit is suitable for use outdoors.
- This Cooling Unit is intended for industrial use.
- This Cooling Unit is rated IP24.
- Do not throw away this user manual, keep it for reference.

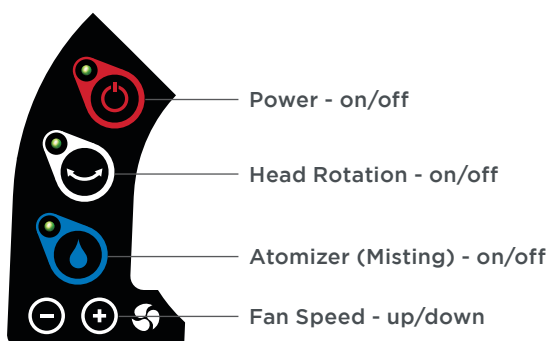

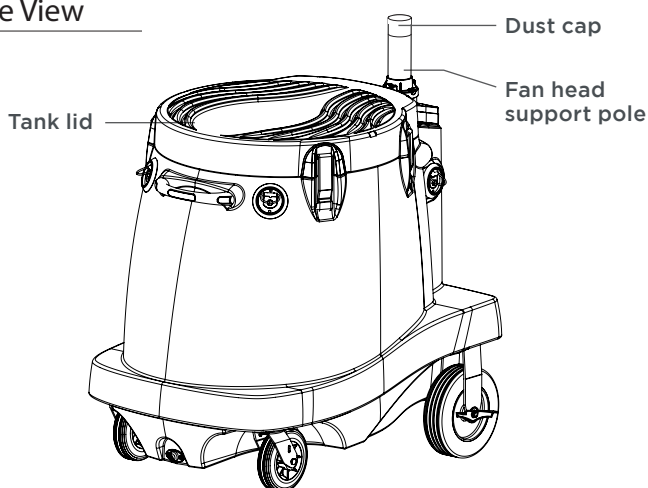
Rear View



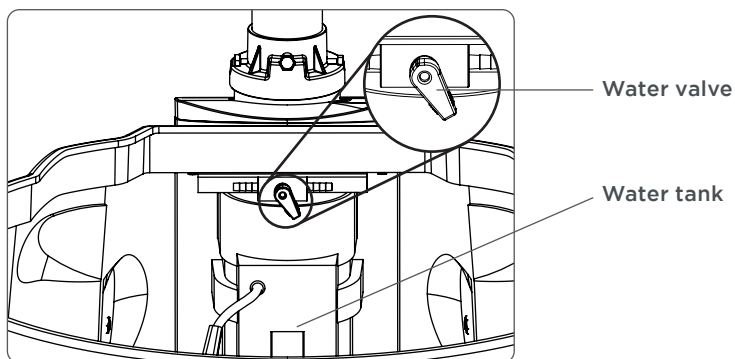
Control Panel

II. SETUP

1. Mounting the fan head:



To set up your Cooling Unit, you will need:

- 2 people
- An AC outlet (110v or 220v)
- Access to water to fill the tank

Remember:

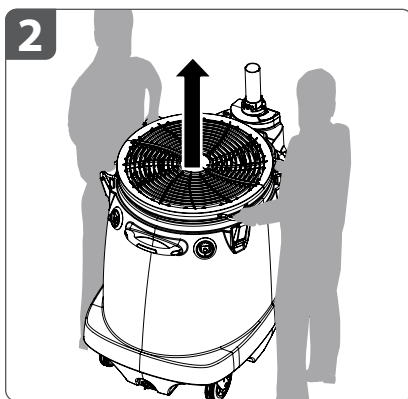
- Lift **fan head** only by the black outer shell from the top and bottom.
- **Never** lift from the fan guards.
- **Depending on the model, the Fan Head weighs ~65–90 lbs.**



1a. Before you get started, be sure to lock each of the **rear wheels** by pressing down on the brakes to set them to the **LOCK** position.

1b. Unlock the **lid latches** (4) and remove the lid.

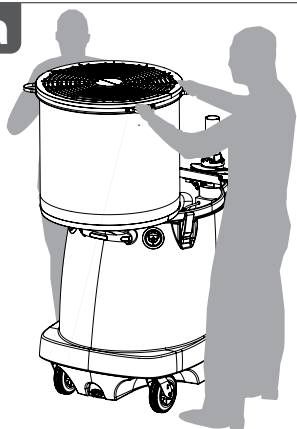
1c. Remove the blue **dust cap** from the **fan head support pole**.



2a. To lift the **fan head** out of the **tank**, each person should stand on either side of Cooling Unit.

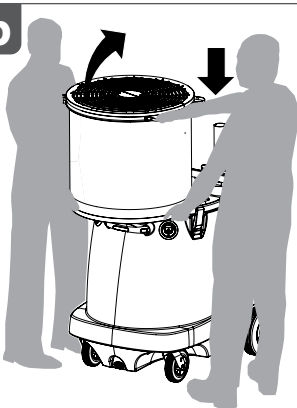
2b. Each person should hold the fan head by a **straps**, as shown.

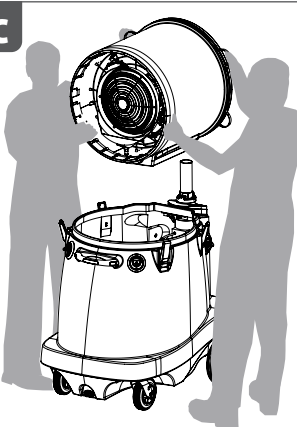
- 3a. Lift the **fan head** straight up and out of the **tank**. Carefully rest it on the **edge of the tank** opposite of the **fan head support pole**, as shown.

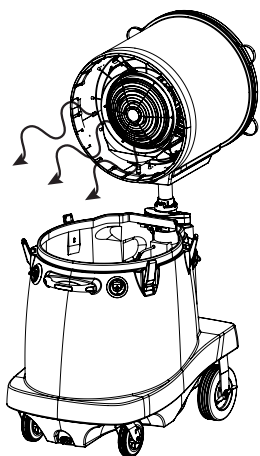
- 3b. Adjust your grip so that each person has one hand on a **strap** and one hand on the **bottom** of the **fan head**.

- 3c. Once again, lift the **fan head** and **align it with the fan head support pole**. Turn the **fan head** until you feel it engage.

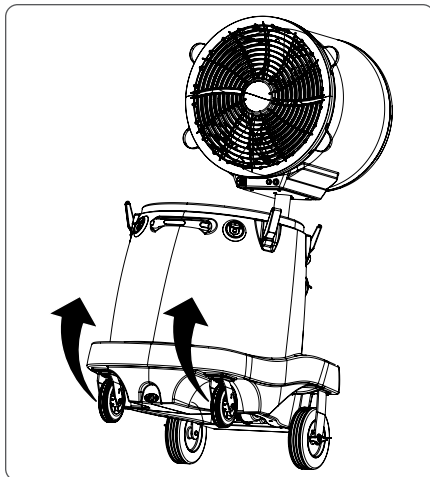

Once installed, the **atomizer** (metal disk) will be facing the **tank**, air will be blown over the **tank** when the Cooling Unit is turned on.



WARNING TIPPING HAZARD



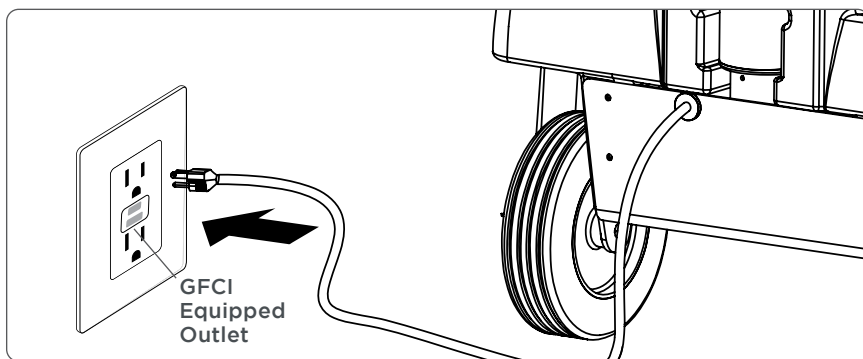
NEVER install or rotate fan head so that it faces the away from the tank. Doing so may allow the Cooling Unit to become unstable and create a tipping hazard.



2. Using the correct outlet:

Electrical current of 110v or 220v is required.

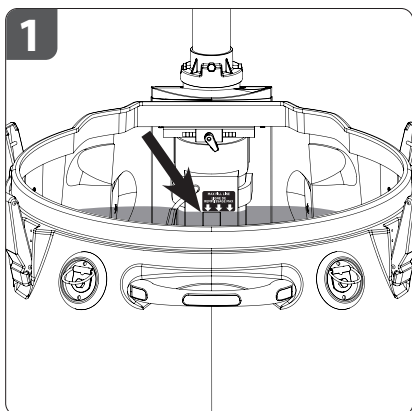
For safety, only plug your Cooling Unit into an outlet equipped with GFCI.

DO NOT plug into standard outlet without a GFCI feature.

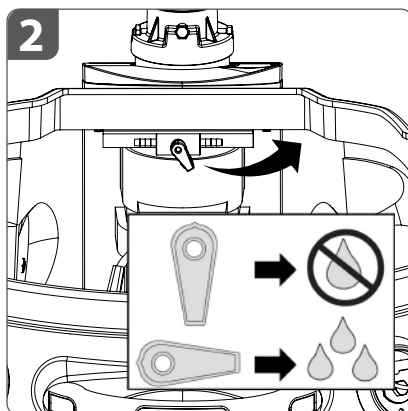


NOTE: A live power outlet can be verified when the Cooling Unit is **plugged in and powered off** by pressing the **oscillation**  or **water**  buttons. The LED lights will dimly illuminate when either of these buttons are depressed.

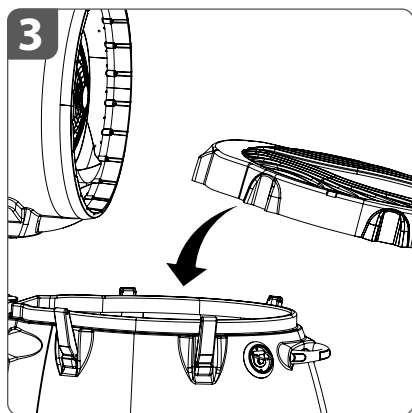
3. Adding water to the tank:



Do not fill the tank above the **max fill level**, as shown. If tank is filled past this level, water may leak out of the tank and cause a hazard around the Cooling Unit.



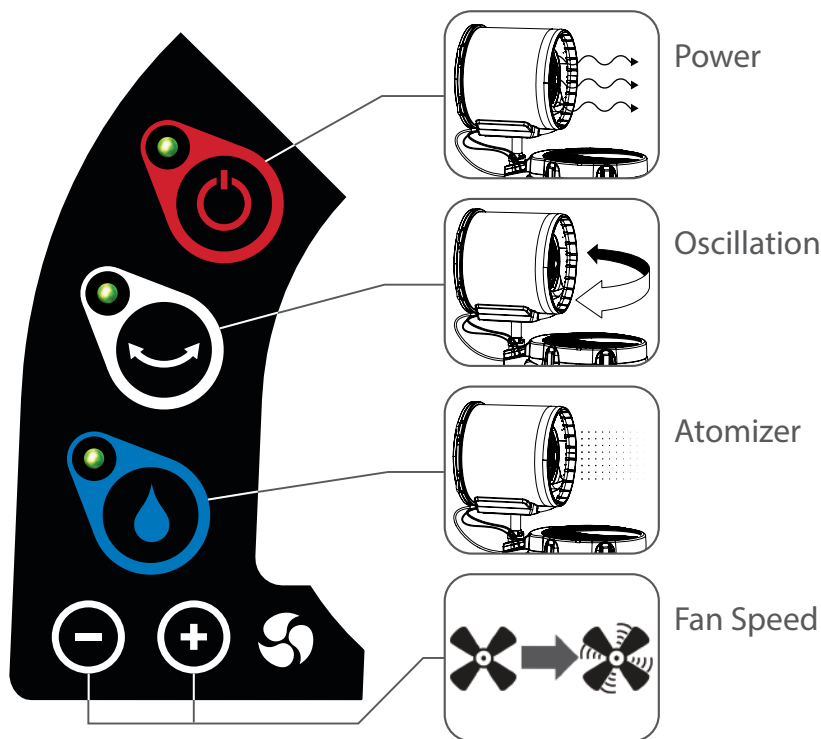
The **water valve** can be adjusted for optimal performance according to climate. To adjust, please follow the steps on the next page.









Once tank has been filled to the desired level, place **lid** on tank and close all **lid latches** (4).

III. OPERATION

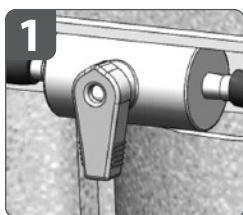
1. Control panel – Buttons:



2. Turning on your Cooling Unit:

- 1a. Press the **power button**  and **hold for one second**.
The **LED light for the power button** will be lit and the fan blades will begin to slowly rotate to indicate the Cooling Unit is powered on.
- 1b. Press the **fan speed button**  to increase the fan speed.
Adjust the fan speed by pressing the  or  buttons.
- 1c. Press the **oscillation button**  once to activate the oscillation feature.
- 1d. Press the **atomizer button**  once to activate the misting feature.

3. Adjusting the misting level:




1a. Press the **power button**  and **hold for one second** if Cooling Unit is not already on.

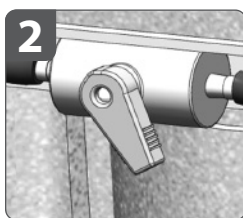
1b. Set **fan speed** to desired level.

1c. Locate the **water valve**.

The **water valve** is located inside the reservoir tank towards the rear of the tank.

1d. Start with the **water valve** closed, at the 6 o'clock position as shown.

1e. Start the atomizer by pressing the **atomizer button**  once.



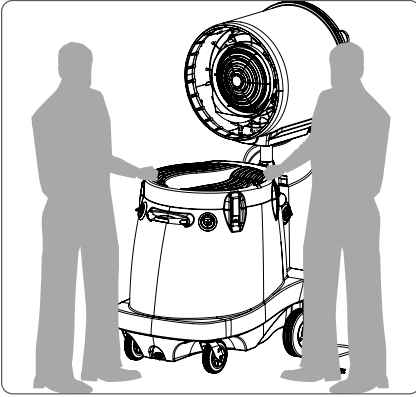
2a. Open the **water valve** slightly and check the distance of the mist. There will be a short delay before misting begins.

2b. If there is a strong mist at 6 feet away, then the moisture setting is too high for conditions.

To reduce misting, rotate the **water valve** lever back towards the 6 o'clock position.

Optimal moisture settings can also be adjusted according to personal preference.

IV. DISASSEMBLY

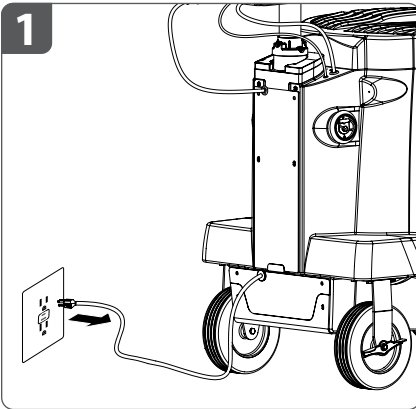


To disassemble your Cooling Unit, you will need:

- 2 people

Remember:

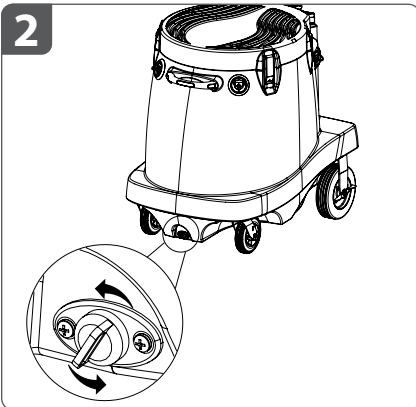
- Lift **fan head** only by the black outer shell from the top and bottom.
- **Never** lift from the fan guards or metal disk.
- **Depending on the model, the Fan Head weighs ~65–90 lbs.**



1a. Power off the Cooling Unit by holding down the **power button**  for one second.

1b. Unplug **power cord**.

1c. Be sure to lock each of the **rear wheels** by pressing down on the brakes to set them to the **LOCK** position.

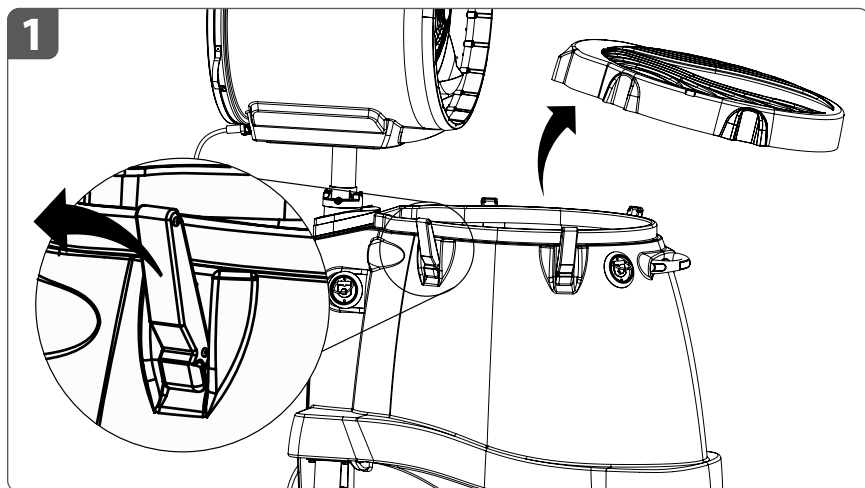


Drain tank:

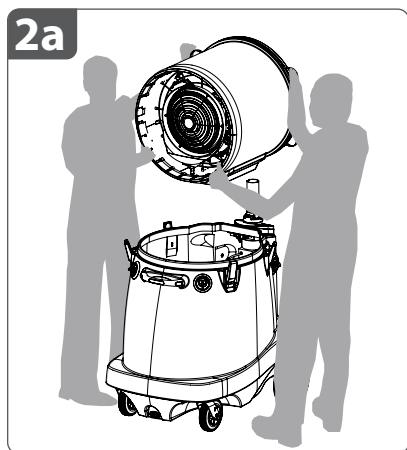
Depending on volume of water to be drained, you may want to move your Cooling Unit to a suitable location prior to draining.

Open the **drain plug** by turning counter clockwise and fully drain the tank.

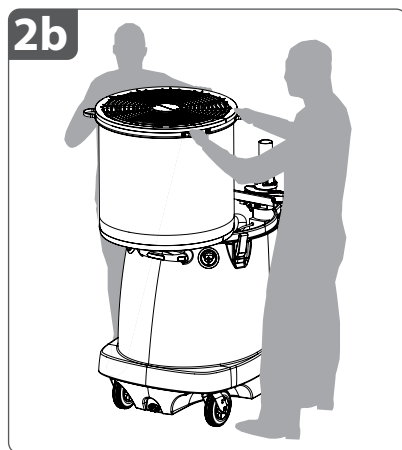
2. Dismounting fan head:



Unlock **lid latches** (4) and remove **lid**. Ensure both **rear wheels** are **locked**.

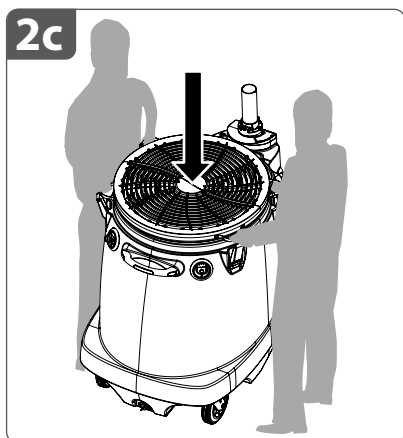


2a. Lift the **fan head** straight up and off the **head support pole**.

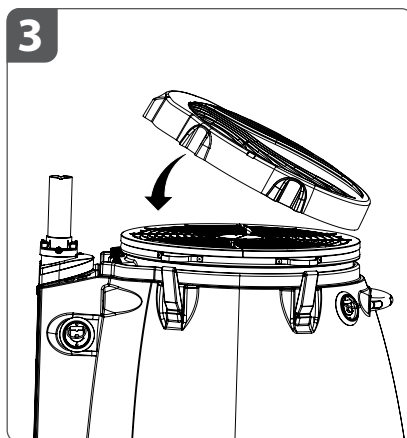


2b. Carefully rest **fan head** on the **edge of the tank** opposite of the **head support pole**, as shown.

Adjust your grip to hold the **fan head** by the **4 straps**.



2c. Carefully lower the **fan head** into the **tank**.



Place **lid** on **tank** and lock all **latches** (4).



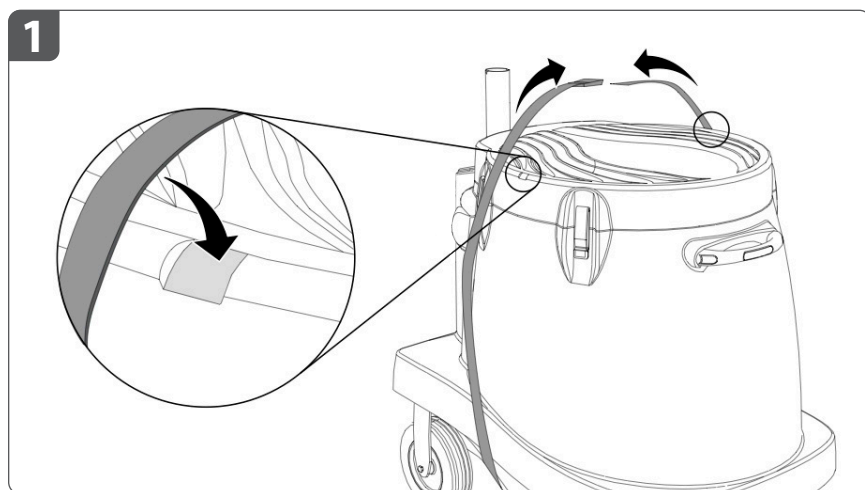
When moving Cooling Unit, be sure to use the **transport handle** and **not the head support pole**.

V. TRANSPORTING YOUR COOLING UNIT

We recommend using tie-downs when transporting your Cooling Unit to limit movement and prevent damage.

For long term storage, make sure that the tank is fully dry. If it is not dry, you may use the fan to dry the tank.

- With the fan head in the tank, and turn on the fan on a medium speed. The tank will dry in about **10 minutes**.



Secure the Cooling Unit by wrapping a band around it, following the grooves on the tank with the strap.

VI. MAINTAINING YOUR COOLING UNIT

For the best performance and longest life of your Cooling Unit, we recommend the following maintenance on your Cooling Unit every **30 days** and **prior to storing for extended periods of time**.

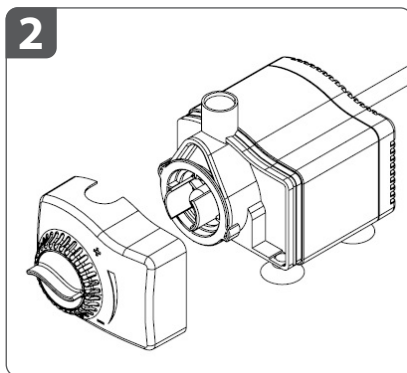
1. Cleaning the water pump:

It is important to clean the water pump. Dirty pumps will continue to run dry if they are not serviced even though they are equipped with auto shut off.

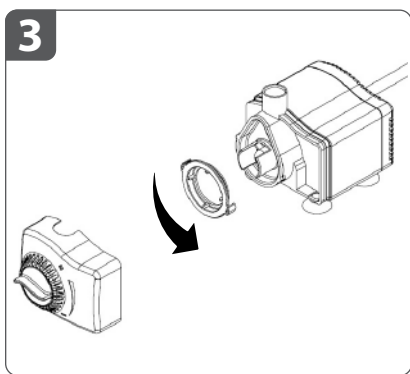


1a. Remove the rear cover by pulling the cover off.

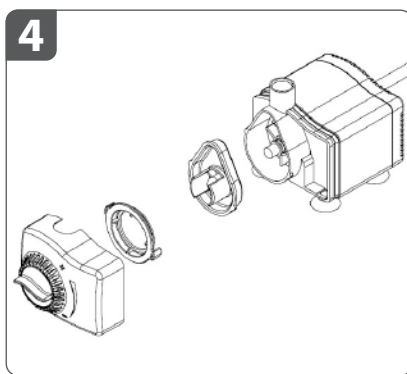
1b. Clean sensors with a brush and water, use a mild soap if necessary.



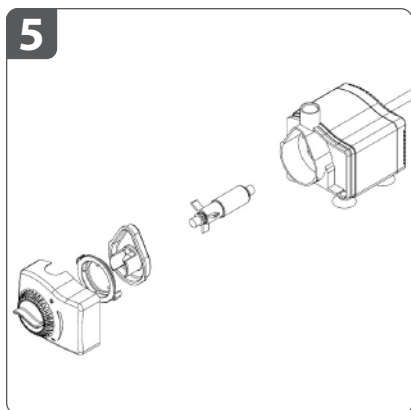
Pull the front cover to remove it.



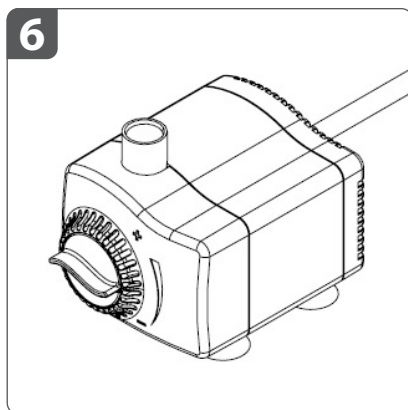
Remove locking ring by turning counter clockwise.



Pull impeller cover to remove it.



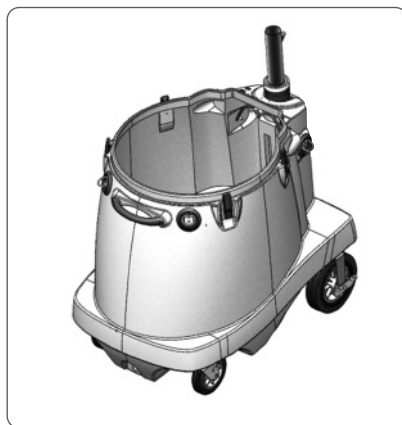
Remove impeller assembly and clean with soap and water.



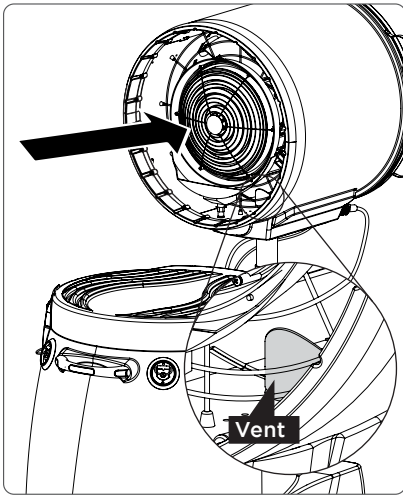
Reassemble water pump.

2. Maintaining the water tank:

- The Cooling Unit was designed with easy cleaning in mind.
- Once a week drain the tank and allow for the tank to dry out overnight.
- If the inside of the tank becomes slippery/slimy to the touch, drain the Cooling Unit. You can also clean the tank by putting a few drops of liquid soap in water and brushing the inside of the tank with it. Rinse the tank with a hose, then open the drain at the bottom and leave the lid off to allow to air dry.
- If mildew develops, you can flush the system out with a little bleach (run the Cooling Unit). Following the bleach treatment, flush the tank out with clean water and let air dry.



3. Maintaining the fan head and motor:



If you see a collection of dust or debris in the head of the Cooling Unit, clean the Cooling Unit with a hose.

Spray from the front of the fan head. Use a clean cloth to wipe it down.

Avoid spraying water directly into the vent.

4. Additional tips and hints:

Remember, while your Cooling Unit is robust and durable, it must still be handled with a certain level of care. Misuse or failure to properly care of the Cooling Unit will void the warranty.

- When transporting your Cooling Unit, make sure that the Cooling Unit is kept upright and tied down properly – remember it's on wheels!
- When transporting over long distances, disassemble the Cooling Unit and store the head in the tank to prevent damage.
- NEVER move your Cooling Unit by the fan head. Doing so will not only damage your Cooling Unit, but it is also much more difficult to move your Cooling Unit by the head than by the body.
- NEVER manually rotate the head, doing so will damage the rotational assembly. Always use the controls to rotate the head.
- To properly power off your Cooling Unit while it is rotating, first stop the oscillation, and then power off your Cooling Unit.
- Always drain the tank after each use.

VII. TROUBLESHOOTING

First ensure all set up steps have been followed. (See Page 6)

Atomizer not draining properly:

- Adjust drain hose to ensure curve of hose is sloping downward into the tank. Drain hose should not be angled too sharply and it should not be drooping too much as this could cause backage in the hose. Also, ensure the drain hose is not submerged below the water line in the tank.

Atomizing disk is spinning, but there is no water:

- First, verify that the water pump is clean and running. (See Page 17)
- If water is running, but there is no water pumping, the problem is mechanical. Check for the following:
 - Check that the water valve is open. (See Page 12, Image 2)
 - Verify that the pump is clean and running. (See Page 17)
 - If the above steps fail, the pump must be replaced – contact us.

Cooling Unit shuts off:

- If your Cooling Unit shuts off unplug it. Wait 20 seconds, then plug it back in and restart your Cooling Unit.

Cooling Unit will not roll:

- Ensure rear wheel brakes are in the OFF position.

VIII. WARRANTY

Cooling Unit Limited Warranty

For two (2) years from date of shipment to the first purchaser, Maxify Solutions, Inc. ("Manufacturer") warrants the fan, fan blades, fan motor, air straighteners and the polyethylene exterior of the Cooling Unit to be free from defects in materials or workmanship. Those components found, upon examination by factory-authorized personnel, to be defective in material or workmanship will be repaired or replaced with new or remanufactured parts at Manufacturer's or authorized dealer's option and without charge. All other Cooling Unit components have a one (1) year warranty from the shipment date against defects in materials or workmanship. Transportation charges on parts submitted for replacement or repair under this warranty shall be borne by the purchaser. Any and all repairs and replacements must be performed by Manufacturer or an authorized Cooling Unit dealer or representative. Warranty claims must be made as soon as reasonably possible after a defect is discovered, but before the end of the warranty coverage on the particular part. When a warranty repair or replacement is needed, the Cooling Unit must be brought to the Manufacturer's or authorized dealer's place of business during normal business hours. A reasonable time must be allowed for the performance of repairs or replacements.

THESE WARRANTIES ARE THE ONLY EXPRESS WARRANTIES BY MANUFACTURER ON THE COOLING UNIT. THESE WARRANTIES ARE LIMITED IN DURATION TO THE TIME PERIOD(S) OF THESE WRITTEN WARRANTIES. THESE WARRANTIES ARE IN LIEU OF ALL OTHER OBLIGATIONS, LIABILITIES OR WARRANTIES, WHETHER EXPRESS OR IMPLIED. THESE WARRANTIES DO NOT COVER:

- (1) NORMAL DETERIORATION OR FADING OF COLOR, COSMETIC OR APPEARANCE ITEMS;
- (2) DAMAGE OR MALFUNCTION DUE TO IMPROPER REPAIR DUE TO ANY UNAUTHORIZED ALTERATION OR MODIFICATION MADE TO THE COOLING UNIT;
- (3) USE OF CIVILIAN/INDUSTRIAL MODELS IN MILITARY APPLICATIONS OR ON MILITARY INSTALLATIONS;
- (4) DAMAGE OR MALFUNCTION DUE TO ABUSE, NEGLECT, ACCIDENT OR FIRE;
- (5) DAMAGE CAUSED BY A NON-COVERED, UNAUTHORIZED PART; AND
- (6) FAILURE TO FOLLOW MANUFACTURER'S CLEANING AND MAINTENANCE GUIDELINES.

MANUFACTURER AND ITS AUTHORIZED DEALERS AND DISTRIBUTORS SHALL NOT BE LIABLE FOR ANY LOSS OF USE OF THE COOLING UNIT, FOR ANY ALTERNATE EQUIPMENT, FOR ANY DAMAGE TO GOODS, COMMERCIAL LOSS, LOSS OF TIME OR INCONVENIENCE, OR FOR ANY OTHER INCIDENTAL OR CONSEQUENTIAL DAMAGES.
